Prompts patients to watch educational videos to enhance patient teaching and prepare them for providing care at home







Education Reminder Prompts




-When patients are assigned videos through EPIC, they will receive three notifications. -The first one is a small

-The first one is a small reminder prompt letting them know they will have education



-The second one is in the form of a new priority space. -This new space will have a live ticker telling them how many videos they have left to complete



-The last notification is a prompt that will take over the whole screen which gives them the option to watch no or remind them to watch it later.






